

US storm chaser films: tornado from 50m away

Storm chaser Andy Gabrion has filmed a tornado in the US state of Colorado from only 50 yards (45m) away.

Mr Gabrion captured video footage of the tornado during the three-hour storm on Monday.

He says winds reported from the tornado, which knocked down electricity poles and produced tennis ball-sized hailstones.
