From the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child

Every child has these rights, among others:

Article 22: You have the right to protection and help if you are a .

This is someone who has to leave their home because of war or another emergency in the area where they live.

Article 24: You have the right to , such as good hospitals and doctors, and to both clean water and nutritious food.

Article 27: You have the right to basic needs: food, clothing and shelter.

If there is a of these needs, or not enough, others should help you.

Article 29: You have the right to be treated with , no matter what you are. This means people should respect those from all countries and backgrounds.

Article 30: You have the right to your particular culture, religion and language. People must respect .

Article 38: You have the right not to be a of war.

Adults must protect you during wars, including within countries.

Making Predictions about the Future

To express a prediction about the future, use **will/won't + verb**. The contraction **'ll** can replace **will**.

The adverbs **definitely** and **probably** show how certain you are. The adverb goes after **will** or before **won't**.

For less certain predictions, use the modals **may/might + verb**. These modals have the same meaning. The negative forms are **may not** and **might not**.

We often use verbs such as **think**, **hope** and **believe** before predictions. They are followed by a complete clause with a subject and verb. The clause sometimes begins with **that**.

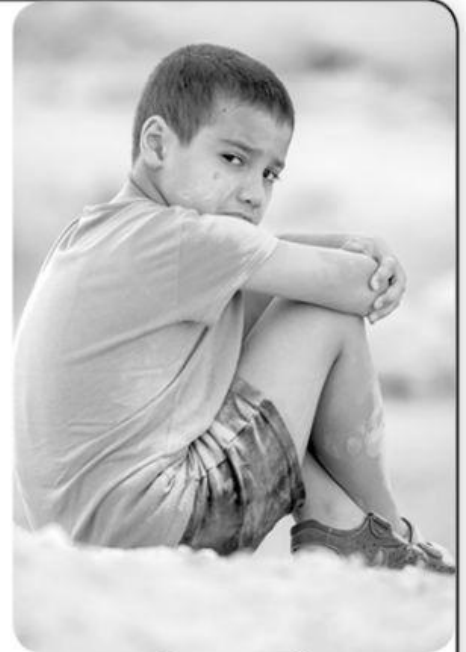
