The present simple negative (he doesn't go)



Alison **doesn't**
get up at 6 o'clock.
She gets up at
7 o'clock.



We use the present simple negative to talk about things we do not usually do. With **he**, **she** and **it** we use **doesn't** and the verb.

He doesn't go to school.
She doesn't have breakfast.
It doesn't go to bed.

doesn't = **does not**




