

# Frequency adverbs in present simple

## Remember:

- ✓ We use some adverbs to describe how frequently we do an activity.
- ✓ An adverb of frequency goes **before** a main verb (except with To Be).
- ✓ An adverb of frequency goes **after** the verb To Be.
- ✓ When we use an auxiliary verb (will, must, could, can, etc.), the adverb is placed between the auxiliary and the main verb.
