

Wh-questions 2

Imagine you did not understand the underlined words.

Ask a question to hear that part again (the answer to your question must be the underlined part of the sentence):

1. We are reading a book about computers.
2. The teacher was copying the questions on the board.
3. Johnny's read the text.
4. They were drawing the horse using a computer.
5. We are studying because we have an exam tomorrow.
6. I was making three sandwiches.
7. We're buying three bottles of wine. (Not "three bottles", so the question is not "*How many bottles...?*")
8. I'm getting up at half-past seven this week.
9. I'm going on holiday in July.
10. He's driving his mother's car. (Do not start with *Which...?*, because what you want to know is who owns the car.)
