
### STRANGE CREATURES


Last year a man found some strange hair. Scientists studied it, but it wasn't from a human or an animal. Was it from a yeti? It's a mystery!



## Regular verbs

Spelling rules	Examples
base form + <b>ed</b>	walk → play →
verbs ending in <b>-e</b> + <b>d</b>	like → move →
verbs ending in <b>a consonant</b> + <b>y</b> ↓ change <b>y</b> → <b>i</b> + <b>ed</b>	carry → study →
Some verbs ending in <b>a single consonant</b> + the second last letter is <b>a vowel</b> → <b>double the last letter</b> + <b>ed</b>	plan → stop →
