A -18-year-old John Neville, who is a bass guitarist in a buzz band, has his finger on the pulse of the popular music scene. "I usually

check out the web, and then follow the music of groups I consider worthwhile. I want to see if they're just as good on stage as they are online," he says. "It is great being there up close with people who play the same music as you, and who play in the same world as you do," he says. "The crowd chants but I watch intently, tuning into the finer points. For me, seeing other buzz bands perform is sort like doing homework". John lingers around the side of the stage, waiting for the buzz band's break to strike up a conversation. He interacts and networks. "The more I learn, the closer I get to my dream," says John. He's just your average buzz band member – virtually unknown today, perhaps a household name tomorrow.

B-Anne Landers, age 15, is a *Bryn Christopher* fan. His posters are plastered all over the room and his music has been blasting from her iPod since she first heard it. She likes everything about him- his voice, his face, his hair and the fact that he's just a nice guy. "He is a guy living his dream," says Anne. Recently, Anne's own dream came true when her parents agreed to let her go to her idol's concert. "Cindy and I had been counting down the moments for our first ever live concert," she said. "Once there, we could not believe that it was really happening. Our knees trembled." Anne and her friend waited for 45 minutes in a line to buy an overpriced Christopher T-shirt. "You just don't worry about getting a value-for-money deal on a t-shirt during a once-in-a-lifetime experience," she explains. "I lost myself in the music," says Anne. "I feel changed.
