## AUTHOR'S STYLE WORD CHOICE

An author's **word choice** refers to his or her selection of particular words to convey meaning and to express specific ideas and attitudes.

Like writers of fiction and poetry, nonfiction writers also use vivid language, or strong, precise words. Using strong verbs and precise adjectives helps readers picture descriptions and actions and makes the writing more interesting.

Example, the sentence

A big dog went by.

An enormous dog with curly black hair trotted down the gravel driveway.
