(a) <u>If it rains tomorrow,</u> <u>we will stay home.</u> If-clause main clause	An <i>if</i>- clause begins with if and has a subject and a verb.
(b) <u>We will stay home</u> <u>if it rains tomorrow.</u> main clause if-clause	An <i>if</i>-clause can come before or after a main clause.
(c) If it rains tomorrow, we won't go on a picnic. (d) I'm going to buy a new car next year if I have enough money. If I don't have enough money for a new car next year, I'm going to buy a used car.	The SIMPLE PRESENT (not will or be going to) is used in an if-clause to express future time.
