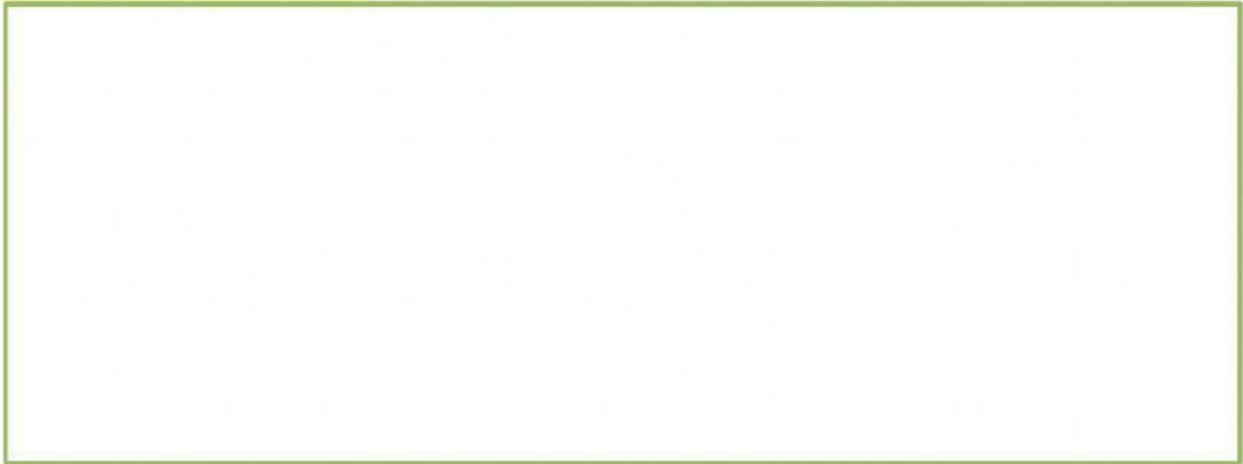


TAXONOMY. WHAT'S IN A NAME?
