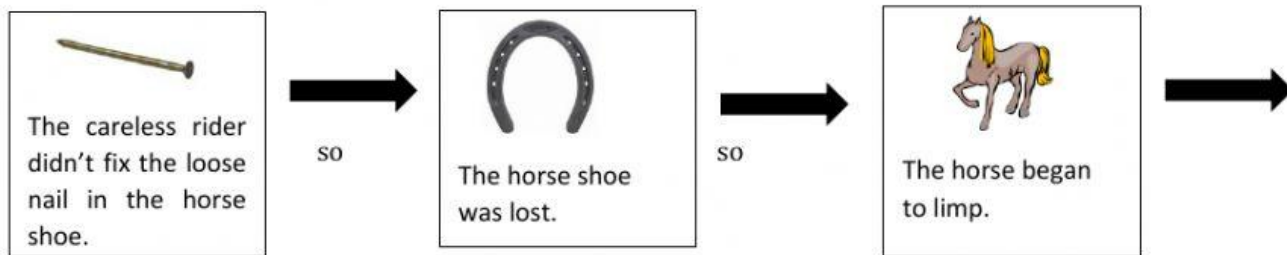
Cause and Effect

- The cat drank up the milk as/ for it was hungry.

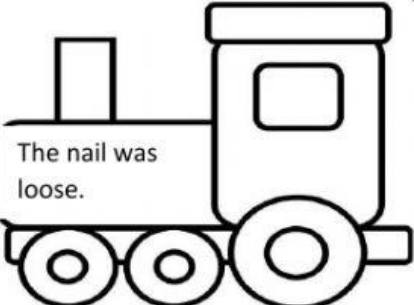
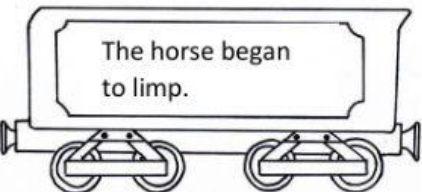
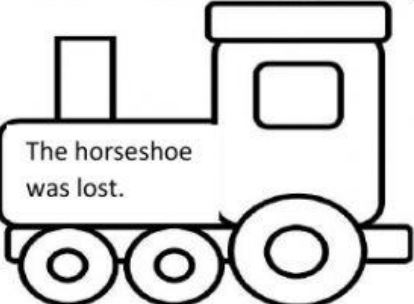
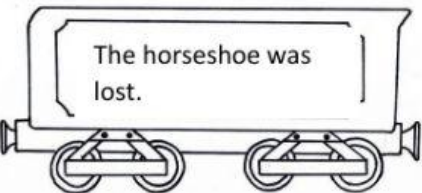
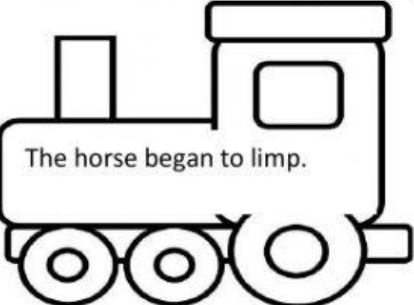
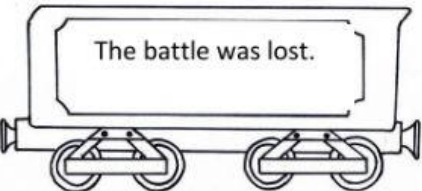
Cause: (reason) The cat was hungry.

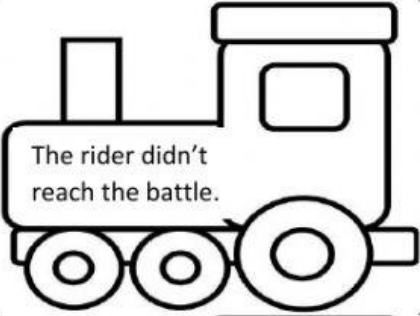
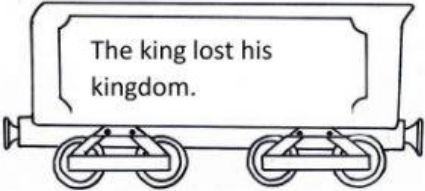
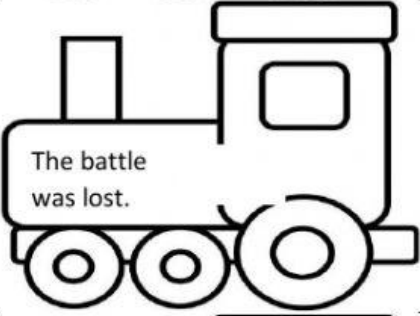
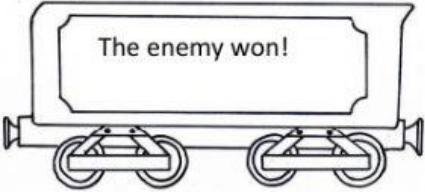
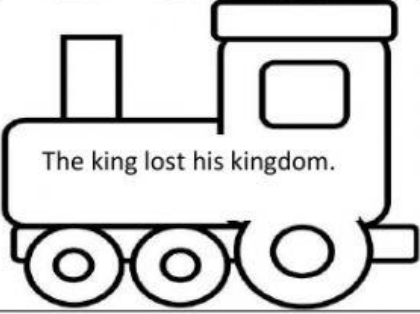
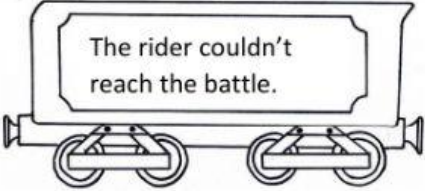
Effect: (result – what happens) It drank up the milk.
