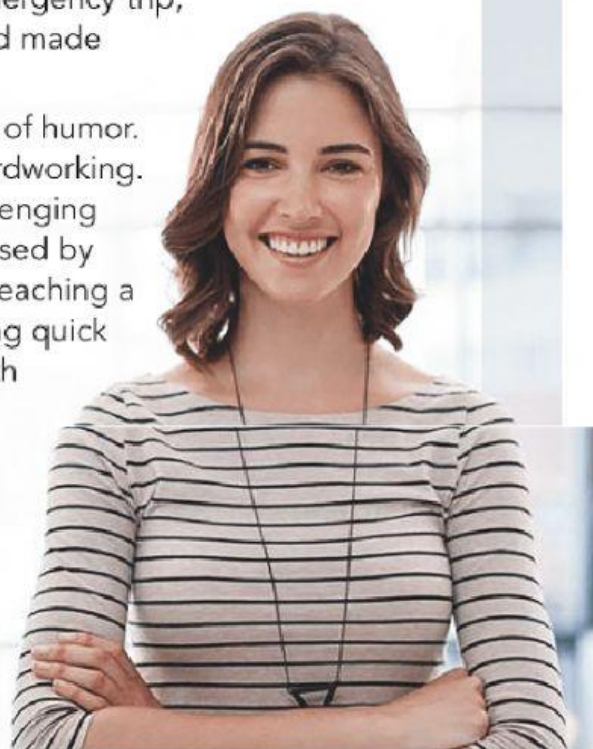

To write an effective personal recommendation, it's important to:

- explain how you know the person: *I first met Julia five years ago.*
- share details about someone's relevant personal qualities: *She was one of the most thoughtful people I have ever met.*
- give specific examples of those qualities: *She offered to babysit for us even though she had made other plans.*
- offer to provide more information: *Please feel free to contact me.*

Text builder order of adjectives

When we use more than one adjective before a noun, adjectives of opinion come before adjectives of fact:

*Julia is an **easygoing** **young** woman.*

*She cooked **delicious** **Italian** meals for us.*

*Julia worked on a number of **challenging** **environmental** projects.*

Look! Always use a comma between two adjectives of the same kind, e.g., two adjectives of opinion:

*Julia was a **cooperative, considerate** roommate.*
