Writing skills: Commas

We use commas to separate parts of a sentence. This makes the meaning clear and the sentence easier to read. Here are some rules for when we use commas.

We usually put a comma before *but*.

I like the beginning of the book, but I don't like the ending.

We always put a comma after *however* when it comes at the beginning of a sentence.

The story moves slowly. However, it is never boring.

We don't put a comma before *because*.

I love the book because the plot is very interesting.

We use a comma to separate items in a list.

The book has an introduction, ten chapters, and questions at the end.
