EVER	Para hablar de experiencias de la vida (alguna vez en la vida)	QUESTIONS	Have you EVER seen a famous actor?
NEVER	Para hablar de experiencias de la vida (nunca en la vida)	NEGATIVE sentences with a positive verb.	I have NEVER eaten sushi.
ALREADY	Para hablar de algo que ya sucedió	AFFIRMATIVE sentences	I have ALREADY seen that film.
JUST	Para hablar de algo que ya sucedió, pero recién, acaba de pasar.	AFFIRMATIVE sentences	I have JUST seen Mary. (me la acabo de cruzar)
YET	Para hablar de algo que esperábamos que suceda pero todavía no sucedió.	NEGATIVE sentences	She hasn't arrived YET .
	Para preguntar si algo ya sucedió	QUESTIONS	Have you done your homework YET ?
