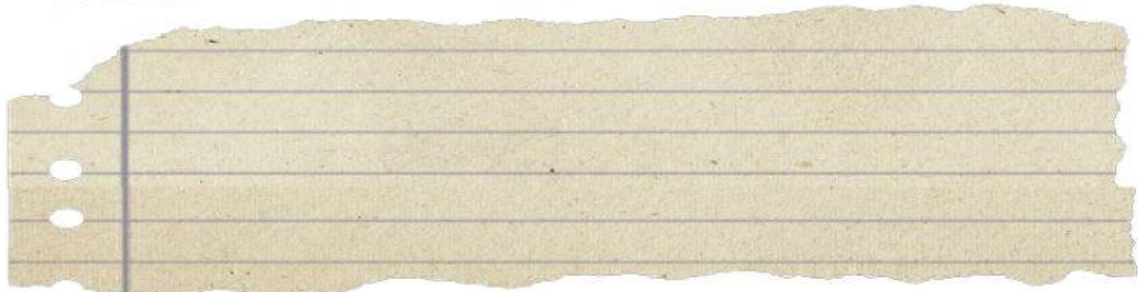
Where does the story of "There will be soft rains" take place? What is the date?



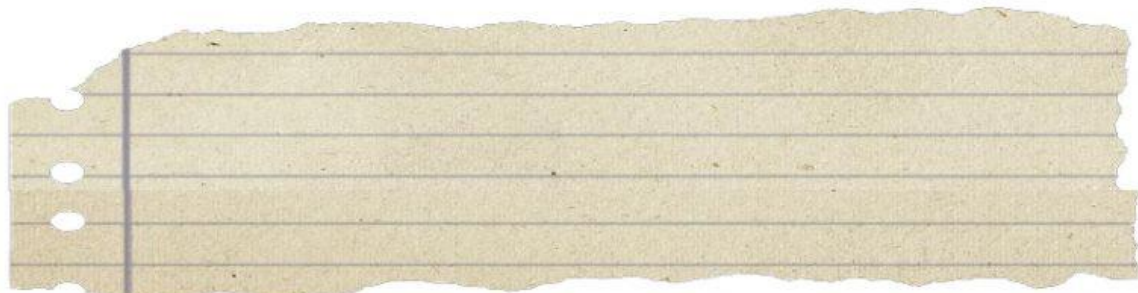
Who is in charge of doing the housework in the house in the story?



Is the house inhabited by people? Yes, or not? If the answer is no, why does the house continue doing the routine?

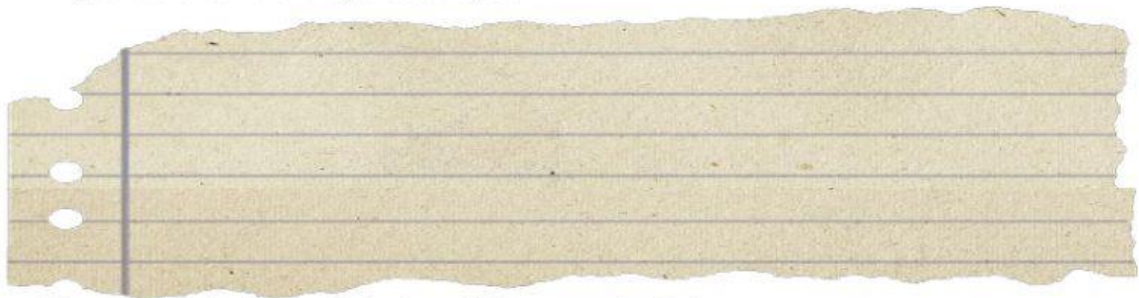

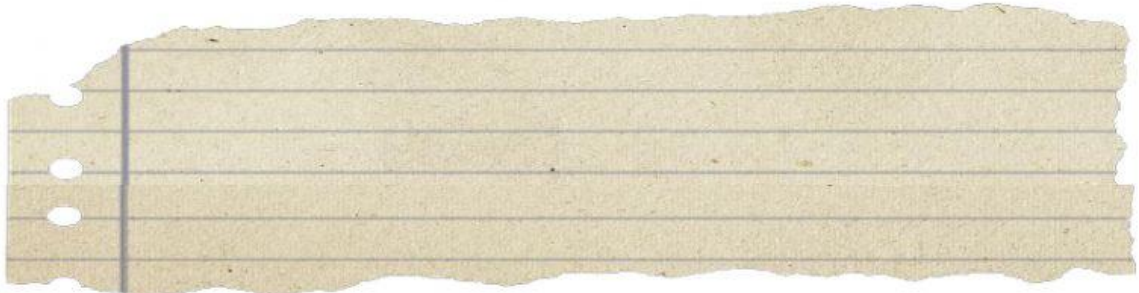
Why do you think Mrs. McClellan liked to listen to Sara Teasdale's poems?
