



## Comparative Adjectives

Comparative adjectives are used to compare differences between the two objects they modify (larger, smaller, faster, higher). They are used in sentences where two nouns are compared.

Rule #	Spelling Rule	Example
1	If the adjective ends in <i>-e</i> , add <i>-r</i> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• nice → nicer</li><li>• safe → safer</li><li>• large → larger</li></ul>
2	If the adjective ends in a consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) pattern, double the final consonant and add <i>-er</i> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• big → bigger</li><li>• wet → wetter</li><li>• flat → flatter</li></ul>
3	If the adjective ends with a consonant + <i>-y</i> , change <i>-y</i> to <i>-i</i> and add <i>-er</i> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• easy → easier</li><li>• funny → funnier</li><li>• pretty → prettier</li></ul>
4	For all other adjectives, add <i>-er</i> .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• tall → taller</li><li>• soft → softer</li><li>• loud → louder</li></ul>

# Comparative Adjective

- The Comparative adjectives are those adjectives which compare the difference between the characteristic of two different nouns in a sentence.

# Comparative adjectives

⊕ We use **comparative adjectives** to show change or make comparisons:

- *This car is certainly **better**, but it's much **more expensive**.*
- *I'm feeling **happier** now.*
- *We need a **bigger** garden.*

⊕ We use *than* when we want to **compare one thing with another**:

- *She is two years **older than** me.*
- *New York is much **bigger than** Boston.*
- *He is a **better player than** Ronaldo.*
- *France is a **bigger country than** Britain.*



⊕ When we want to **describe how something or someone changes** we can use two comparatives with *and*:


- *The balloon got **bigger and bigger**.*
- *Everything is getting **more and more expensive**.*
- *Grandfather is looking **older and older**.*

⊕ We often use *the* with comparative adjectives to **show that one thing depends on another**:

- ***The faster** you drive, **the more dangerous** it is.  
(= When you drive faster, it is more dangerous.)*
- ***The higher** they climbed, **the colder** it got.  
(= When they climbed higher, it got colder.)*

## Superlative adjectives

Superlative adjectives are used to describe an object which is at the upper or lower limit of a quality (the tallest, the smallest, the fastest, the highest). They are used in sentences where a subject is compared to a group of objects.

Short adjectives	Spelling rules	Examples
Usually	+ est	slow → the slowest fast → the fastest tall → the tallest
Ending in -e	+ st	large → the largest nice → the nicest
Ending in a consonant + y	-y → -i + est	hungry → the hungriest happy → the happiest funny → the funniest
Ending in a vowel + a consonant	double the consonant + est	big → the biggest fat → the fattest fit → the fittest

# Superlative adjective

- A superlative adjective is a type of adjective which is used to express the highest degree of comparison.
