

Simple Present

Affirmative

I / You / We / They + base form verb + complement.

He / She / It + base form verb + -s/-es/-ies + complement.

Example: We live in Monterrey. / She lives in Monterrey.

Negative

I / You / We / They + don't + base form verb + complement.

He / She / It + doesn't + base form verb + complement.

Example: We don't live in Monterrey. / She doesn't live in Monterrey.

Interrogative

Do + I / you / we / they + base form verb + complement?

Does + he / she / it + base form verb + complement?

Example: Do you live in Monterrey? / Does she live in Monterrey?
