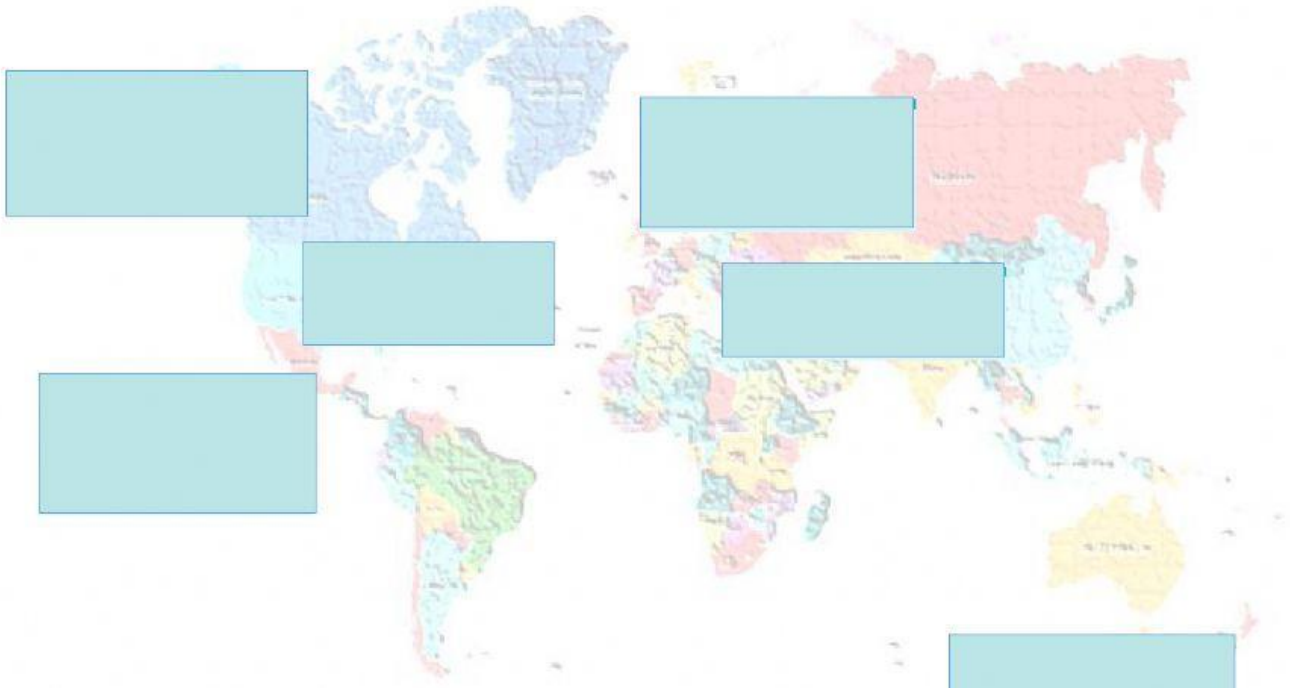


Women rights



In 1893, New Zealand gave women equal voting rights.

In 1917, women in the Netherlands were given the right to be candidates in their elections.

In 1920, the United States gave women equal voting rights in all states.

In 1947, women in **Mexico** were given partial voting right, but it was not until 1953 that they were given the right to vote and to be voted in national elections.

In 1869, women were granted the right to vote in the United Kingdom. However, that right was only for women who were single or owned a land.

In 1918, Canada became the first country in America to give women the right to vote. However, women from Québec and from native provinces were not included.
