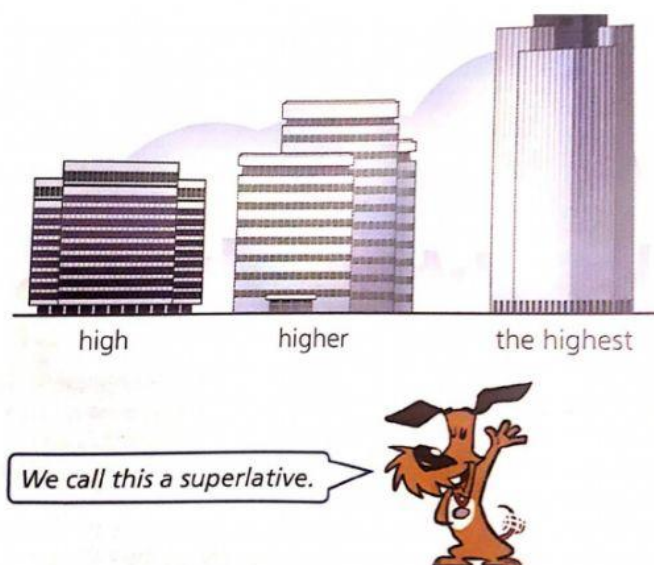


Superlatives



We use the superlative when we compare three or more things or people. We use "the" before the superlative.

To form the superlative of adjectives, we add **-est** to the adjective. Be careful with the spelling changes!!

Adjective Superlative

Small	—	the smallest	(el más pequeño)
Long	—	the longest	(el más largo)
Big	—	the biggest	(el más grande)
Hot	—	the hottest	
Nice	—	the nicest	
Large	—	the largest	
Heavy	—	the heaviest	
Easy	—	the easiest	

When the adjective has two or more syllables, we put "the **most**" before the adjective.

Adjective Superlative

Expensive	—	the most expensive
Beautiful	—	the most beautiful

Examples of sentences:

Mount Everest is **the highest** mountain in the world.

Summer is **the hottest** season of the year.

My team won the championship. I'm **the happiest** person in the world!!

The largest continent is Asia.

We bought **the most** beautiful card in the shop.
