

The difference in Present tense/ Present Progressive/ Simple/Near Future

A. WHEN WE USE THEM

In English and Spanish- both Present (what you learned last year) and Present Progressive talk about things going on right now -

Present tense - more general

Pres. Progressive- IN PROGRESS right now will end shortly

Simple/Near Future- things that are *going to happen* soon

B. HOW TO FORM THE TENSES (if your answer is similar to what I have typed then you are fine)

Present tense - drop -ar, -er and -ir from infinitive add the present tense endings, watch out for irregrs and stem changes
