Ucayali Wildlife Rescue Centre

Hi! My name is Ricardo and I'm a veterinarian at the Ucayali Wildlife Rescue Centre. At this centre, we take care of animals that were rescued in the Peruvian jungle from trafficking. There are a lot of animals here. These are some of the most popular animals that we rescued.



This black monkey is called a spider monkey or *maquisapa*. It lives in the jungle of Peru. It can climb trees because it has long arms and legs and a very flexible tail, but spider monkeys don't have thumbs like other monkeys. The spider monkey can also swing from tree to tree to find fresh fruit.



These little ones are called *Taricaya* turtles. They can't run fast, but they can swim quickly. They have a hard shell on their backs to protect them from predators.

My favourite animals are the macaws. Macaws have colourful wings and beautiful feathers. They can fly long distances. They can learn to repeat some words, but they can't have conversations like us.



All these animals are endangered. We have to take care of them or they could go extinct.

Cusco Wildlife Rescue Centre

Hello! My name is Melissa and I'm a volunteer at the Wildlife Rescue Centre in Cusco. We take care of rescued animals so that one day they can return to the wild. These are some of the most popular animals that we have rescued.



This is *Naga*, the puma. She is three years old and she was rescued from an illegal zoo. She has golden fur and a long, strong tail. She looks like a lion, but she doesn't have a mane. She can jump almost 6 metres horizontally.

Chico is the most popular animal here. He is a condor and he has a wide wingspan, strong claws to catch his prey, a white neck, but condors don't have feathers on their heads. We rescued him from a restaurant. Someone had cut his feathers, so he can't fly yet. We hope he recovers fast so he can return to his habitat in the mountains.



I love taking care of these animals, but it's upsetting to see them wounded. We have to be responsible and protect our wildlife.
