

POSSESSIVES - Adjectives and Pronouns



Adjective	me	your	her	his	our	their
Pronoun	mine	yours	hers	his	ours	theirs

Adjective	Pronoun
It's my honey.	It's mine
It's your honey.	It's yours
It's his honey.	It's his
It's her honey.	It's hers
It's our honey.	It's ours
It's their honey.	It's theirs

A possessive pronoun is used instead of a noun:

Anna's car is red. **Mine** is black.
A possessive adjective is usually used to describe a noun, and it comes before the noun, like other adjectives:


