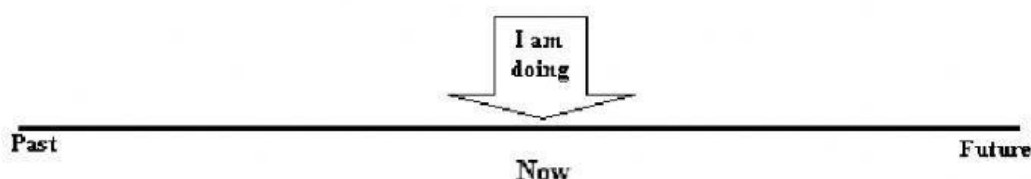

PRESENT CONTINUOUS AND PAST CONTINUOUS



A. The Present Continuous Tense

Present Continuous Timeline



THE PRESENT CONTINUOUS IS USED:

- For actions happening now (right now):

***You are using** the Internet. **You are studying** English grammar.*

- to describe an action that is going on during this period of time or a trend:

***Are you still working** for the same company? More and more people **are becoming** vegetarian.*

- For future arrangements:

***We're going** on holiday tomorrow. **I'm meeting** my boyfriend tonight. **Are they visiting** you next winter?*

- to describe a temporary event or situation:

*He usually plays the drums, but **he's playing** bass guitar tonight. The weather forecast was good, but **it's raining** at the moment.*

- to express annoyance at repeated actions ("always, forever, constantly"):

*Harry and Sally **are always arguing**! **You're constantly complaining** about your mother-in-law!*

- **Signal words:** *right now, at the moment, now, these days*

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➤ **Words that do not take the continuous form:** *to feel, to have, to hear, to taste, to smell, to see*

➤ *If these verbs are used in the continuous aspect, they have **a different meaning:***

This coat **feels** nice. = You notice the quality of the coat (perception)

I`m **feeling** better now. = I`m improving.

I **have** a cat. = possession

I`m **having** dinner. = I`m eating.

I can **see** you texting under the desk. = perception

I`m **seeing** my girlfriend later. = I`m planning to meet her.

FORM: to be (am, is, are) + **VERB + ing** (She is talking on the phone now.)

<u>AFFIRMATIVE</u>	<u>NEGATIVE</u>	<u>INTERROGATIVE</u>
I am talking	I am not talking	Am I talking ...?
You are talking	You are not talking	Are you talking...?
She/He is talking	She/He is not talking	Is she/he talking...?
It is playing	It is not playing	Is it playing...?
We are talking	We are not talking	Are we talking...?
You are talking	You are not talking	Are you talking...?
They are talking	They are not talking	Are they talking...?

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B. The Past Continuous Tense

Past Continuous Timeline



THE PAST CONTINUOUS IS USED:

- to express an action that was in progress at a specific time in the past:
e.g. *What were you doing at 8 pm yesterday? I was reading a book yesterday evening.*
 - to describe the background in a story written in the past tense:
e.g. *The sun **was shining** and the birds **were singing** as the elephant came out of the jungle. The other animals **were relaxing** in the shade of the trees, but the elephant moved very quickly...*
 - to describe an unfinished action that was interrupted by another event or action:
e.g. *I was having a dinner when my friend called.*
 - to indicate that two actions were going on at the same time:
e.g. *I was doing my homework while my brother was playing video games.*
 - to express a change of mind:
e.g. *I **was going** to spend the day at the beach but I've decided to get my homework done instead.*
- **Signal words:** *while, when*

FORM: to **be (was, were) + VERB + -ing** (She was talking on the phone.)

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AFFIRMATIVE

NEGATIVE

INTERROGATIVE

I was talking

I was not talking

Was I talking ...?

You were talking

You were not talking

Were you talking...?

She/He was talking

She/He was not talking

Was she/he talking...?

It was playing

It was not playing

Was it playing...?

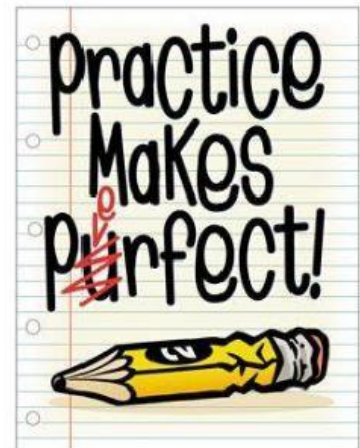
