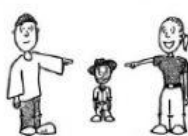


Subject and Object Pronouns

SUBJECT	Subject pronouns replace the subject of a sentence.	Object pronouns serve as the object of a verb.	OBJECT
I	know John.	John knows	me.
You	know John.	John knows	you.
He	knows John.	John knows	him.
She	knows John.	John knows	her.
We	know John.	John knows	us.
They	know John.	John knows	them.
