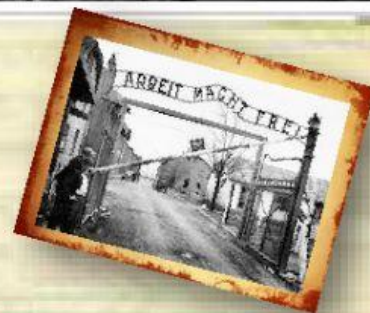

Anne Frank

Anne Frank _____ (be) born on June 12, 1929, in Frankfurt, Germany. Her mother _____ (be) Edith Frank, and her father, Otto Frank, was a lieutenant in the German army during World War I. Ann also _____ (have) a sister named Margot. The Franks _____ (be) a typical middle-class German-Jewish family. When Hitler _____ (become) chancellor of Germany on January 20, 1933, the Frank family _____ (realize) that it was time to flee. They _____ (move) to Amsterdam in the fall of 1933.
