

Present Simple, interrogative

To ask questions in the present simple, we use the auxiliary *do* and the base form of the verb.

Do your sisters **work** on the farm?

Yes, they **do**. / No, they **don't**.

For the third person singular, we use the auxiliary *does* and the base form of the verb.

Does your brother **work** there, too?

Yes, he **does**. / No, he **doesn't**.
