4 important components of CONCLUSION

CONCLUSION	Solution	John apologised profusely to his classmate Peter.
	Emotional adjective	John felt ashamed.
	Show feelings	His face turned a scarlet bright red and his eyes was cast downwards for the rest of the lesson.
	Lesson learnt (gives up character trait) (Use an action verb)	He vowed never to be hot-headed again. From that day onwards, John never jumped to conclusions.
	Proverb	He learnt never to judge a book by its cover.



SCENARIO: Marty was caught cheating on his math test.

CONCLUSION	Solution	Marty was sent to the Principal's office and was suspended from school.
	Emotional adjective	Marty felt ashamed.
	Show feelings	His face turned a bright beet red and he wanted to sink into oblivion.
	Lesson learnt (gives up character trait) (Use an action verb)	
	Proverb	



SCENARIO: After months of practice, Marty became first in the running competition.


CONCLUSION	Solution	The teacher congratulated Marty and gave him a medal.
	Emotional adjective	Marty felt over the moon
	Show feelings	A huge grin spread across his face as he received the shiny gold medal. He puffed out his chest and pumped his fist in the air.
