| 1. one syllable with <u>more than one vowel</u> or <u>more than one consonant at the end</u> .<br>Example: <i>tall -short -cheap -light-old</i> | → <u>add -er</u><br><i>taller -shorter -cheaper -lighter - older</i>                                                        | → <u>add -est</u><br><i>tallest -shortest -cheapest -lightest - oldest</i>                                        |
| 2. one syllable <u>ending with e</u> .<br>Example: <i>wide -fine -cute -nice</i>                                                                | → <u>add -r</u><br><i>wider -finer -cuter -nicer</i>                                                                        | → <u>add -st</u><br><i>widest -finest -cutest -nicest</i>                                                         |
| 3. one syllable <u>with one vowel and one consonant at the end</u> .<br>Example: <i>hot -big -fat -sad</i>                                      | → <u>double the last letter then add -er</u><br><i>hotter -bigger -fatter -sadder</i>                                       | → <u>double the last letter then add -est</u><br><i>hottest -biggest -fattest -saddest</i>                        |
| 4. two syllables <u>ending with Y</u> .<br>Example: <i>easy -happy -silly -lonely</i>                                                           | → <u>change Y to i then add -er</u><br><i>easier -happier -sillier -lonelier</i>                                            | → <u>change Y to i then add -est</u><br><i>easiest -happiest -silliest -loneliest</i>                             |
| 5. <u>two syllables and more</u> not ending with Y ( <u>long adjective</u> ).<br>Example: <i>modern -beautiful -relax</i>                       | → <u>use more before the adjective then than</u><br><i>-more modern than<br/>-more beautiful than<br/>-more relax than.</i> | → <u>use the most before the adjective</u><br><i>-the most modern<br/>-the most beautiful<br/>-the most relax</i> |
| 6. <u>irregular</u> adjectives<br>good<br>bad<br>far                                                                                            | →<br>better than<br>worse than<br>further than                                                                              | →<br>the best<br>the worst<br>the furthest                                                                        |
