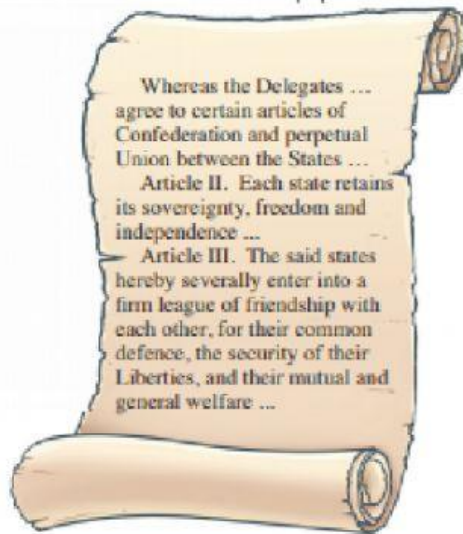


# Sources on the Articles of Confederation

### The Articles of Confederation

The Articles of Confederation marked an important step toward nationhood. The Articles were ratified by each state in 1781. They set forth a government that focused on the sovereignty (independent power) of each individual state. The Articles gave little power to the national government. Congress could not levy the taxes, regulate trade or force states to act in the best interests of the people.
