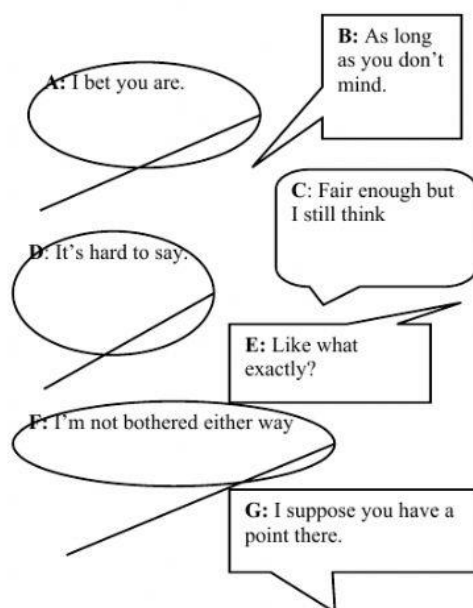

Do you wake up thinking of David Beckham? Or wonder what Brad Pitt is eating for breakfast? If so you could be one of a large number of people suffering from a newly identified psychological condition: Celebrity Obsession Syndrome (COS). **A.** _____ And one in four is so interested in their idol that their obsession affects their daily life. Psychologists at the University of Leicester, who used a celebrity obsession scale to rate the problem found that thirty-six percent of the people studied suffered from some form of COS, and that the number was going up.

One theory is that in a society dominated by reality TV shows and with a decline in family relationships, celebrities have taken the place of relatives, neighbours and friends for many people. Respect for family members has been replaced by the worship of the famous.

The study of around 700 people aged eighteen to sixty discovered there were three types of Celebrity Obsession Syndrome. Those with a mild form – twenty-two percent of the sample- were likely to be extroverts, with a lot of friends. **B.** _____ Twelve percent of the sample showed signs of the moderate form which meant they had an intense personal identification with their idol. The third group, the serious COS sufferers, are solitary, impulsive ant-social and troublesome. **C.** _____ They even believe their celebrity knows them and are prepared to lie, or even die, for their hero. Around two percent of people had the most serious form of the syndrome, meaning their celebrity obsession was borderline pathological.
