The Statue of Liberty

The statue was a **gift** (=present) to America from France and was made in France. The statue is of the Roman goddess of **Freedom**. The Statue represents freedom and is a sign of welcoming immigrants to America.

Times Square

Times Square is a big intersection in the **downtown** (center) of the city. Times Square is **the most** visited tourist site in the world. It is very bright with lights and **advertisements** (publicity).



Central Park

Yankee stadium is the **ballpark** (wonderland) of the New York Yankees Baseball team. The Yankees are one of **the best** and **most** famous baseball teams in America. Derek Jeter is one of **the most** popular players on the team.
