They express a cause and effect.

So + adjective/adverb + that

Cause: It was too windy.

Effect: We couldn't go sailing.

It was **so windy that** we couldn't go sailing.

Such + (adjective) + NOUN + that

Cause: It was a great movie.

Effect: I watched it several times.

It's such a great movie that I've watched it several times.

(great-adjective, movie-noun)
