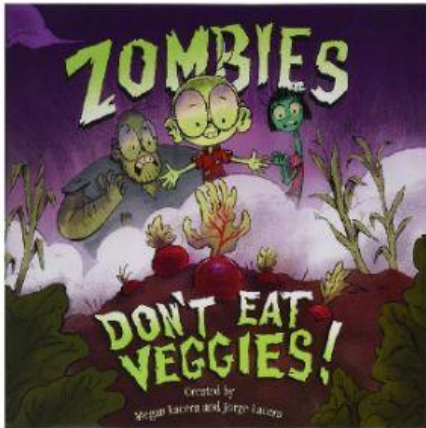


## Zombies Don't Eat Veggies - Story

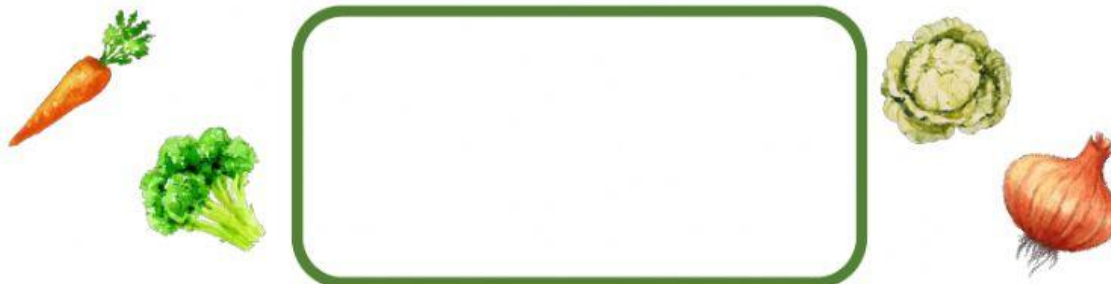
**Part IV:**
