## Ist conditional

expresses true or very probable situation in the present or future.

If + Present Simple, Future Simple
Imperative
can/may/might/ must/should
+ bare infinitive

If it <u>is</u> sunny, we <u>will go</u> to the beach.

If you <u>need</u> help, <u>ask</u> me.

If you <u>do</u> your homework, you <u>can go</u> out.

If you <u>go</u> hiking, you <u>must wear</u> hiking

boots.

## 2nd conditional

expresses untrue or improbable situations in the present or future.

If + Past Simple, would/could/might

+ bare infinitive

If I had more free time, I would take up gardening.

If I won a lot of money in a lottery, I might give some to charity.

## 3rd conditional

expresses unreal, impossible situations in the past.

If + Past Perfect, would have + past participle

If I <u>had seen</u> Robert, I <u>would have talked</u> to him.
