

Armed (1) the teeth they came out of nowhere, an army of discontented students and so-called patriots determined to (2) an end to the civil war that has torn Afghanistan apart (3) the retreat of the Russian forces in 1989. Last week, after a five-month battle, the newcomers had brought a large section of the country (4) their control and got (5) of one of its most powerful warlords.
