2. The farmer **grows** wheat in the fields.
3. Mrs Jones **milks** the cows twice a day.
4. Mary **takes** wildlife photographs every weekend.

### PRESENT CONTINUOUS

1. They **are building** a new clinic in the town.
2. The children **are baking** brownies today.
3. We **are doing** our homework.
4. My father **is washing** the car.

### PRESENT PERFECT

1. They **have** already **discussed** the book.
2. She **has finished** all the housework.
3. They **have lost** all their money.
4. He **has crashed** his car.

### PAST SIMPLE

1. J K Rowling **wrote** the Harry Potter books.
2. They **left** their car in the garage.
3. I **did** all the washing yesterday.
4. She **lost** her watch in the cinema.

### PAST CONTINUOUS

1. I **was washing** the dishes when she arrived.
2. He **was doing** his homework when the phone rang.
3. He **was driving** his car too fast.
4. They **were decorating** the hall for the party.

## PAST PERFECT

1. He **had finished** all his work before he left.
2. The milkman **had delivered** all the milk by 6 o'clock.
3. The thieves **had left** the crime scene before the police arrived.
4. She **had** already **locked** the door before the burglars tried to enter.

## FUTURE SIMPLE

1. The company **will** soon **hire** more workers.
2. He **will kill** the snake if it comes any closer.
3. My dad **will mow** the lawn tomorrow.
4. The dog **will bite** the man if he comes into the garden.

## FUTURE – BE GOING TO

1. I **am going to pay** all his debt.
2. The police **are going to investigate** the murder.
3. They **are going to shoot** the poachers on sight.
4. They **are going to release** several prisoners.

## MODAL

1. I **must wash** my car.
2. The teacher **must teach** the children how to read.
3. She **must cut** her hair before the wedding.
4. We **must take** the dog to the vet.

## INFINTIVE

1. The postman **has to deliver** all the letters.
2. We **have to book** our tickets for the flight.
3. They **have to draw up** a new will.
4. He **has to change** the light bulb before it gets dark.
