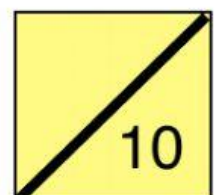

### Topic: An accident

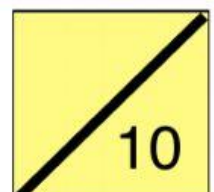
**1** MAKE YOUR AUDIENCE BELIEVE EVERYTHING IS GOING SMOOTHLY AT FIRST!
