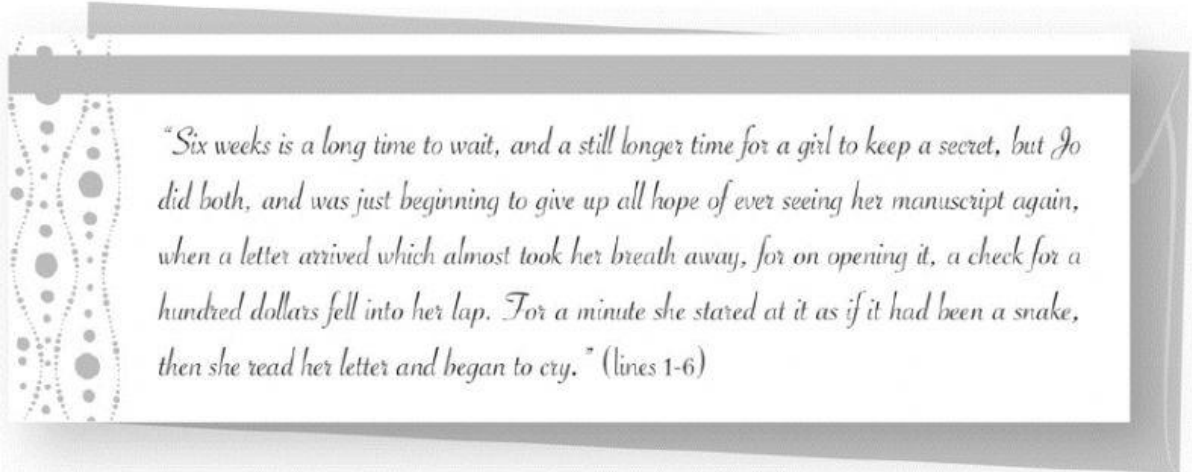

_____. Clay bricks will be substituted by blocks made either of natural cement (the result of bacteria activity) or from fungi (like mushrooms). New eco-friendly manufacturing practices will favor more natural materials and processes. Bioroofs will not only regulate the temperature and generate power from solar energy, but also provide a habitat for pollinators, such as bees, ants, and butterflies. The pathway to your front door can have tiles that turn footsteps into energy. Even gardens will benefit from the combination of tradition and technology, with devices regulating the watering of plants, robots mowing the lawn, and digital art replacing water fountains.

Stepping inside these houses of the future, you'll see kitchens equipped with ovens that recognize the dish in order to know how to properly cook it. Devices will do the cooking and the cleaning up, while refrigerators will connect to your smartphone to let you know when supplies are low.

Heated-seat toilets with nightlights, remote control, and even sensors that analyze your

excrements to tell you something about your health will be present in bathrooms. Other systems will warn you about water waste and some will even recycle water themselves.

What about living rooms? The focus will be on relaxation and entertainment, with plenty to eat and to drink, all provided by robot servers. A central system that connects all devices in the house to the internet will update you on the current news and weather forecast, answer your questions, and carry out tasks. With the dissemination of virtual-reality headsets, you'll be able to go on wild journeys from the comfort of your living room. Add ultrasound devices based on the sense of touch and scent cartridges connected to the internet and you're in for a full sensory experience.

Speaking of senses, bedrooms could have 3-D soundscapes and directional audio devices to generate the perfect soundtrack for your bedtime (think of the ocean or the rain), as well as monitors that identify toxic gases, pollen, and even volatile organic compounds.
