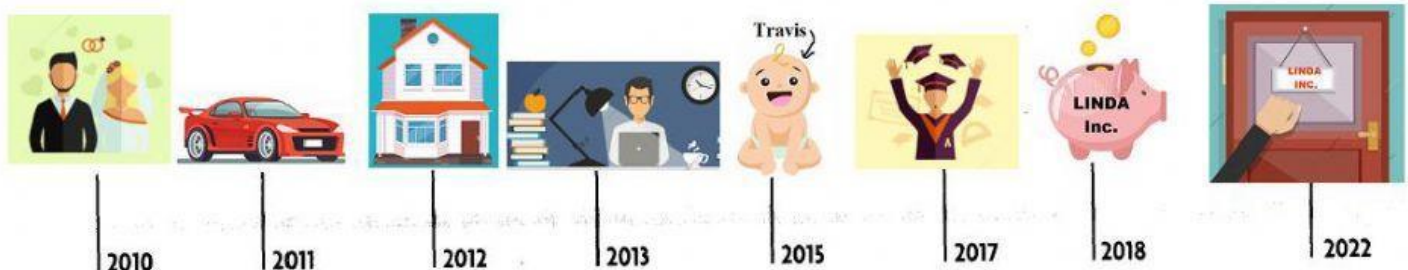
B. Paul wants to be a famous artist, like Winston Plummer. He's reading a text about Winston.
