- A.** There are few animals on Earth who work as well together as meerkats. These squirrel-size members of the mongoose family live in groups of different sizes, from as little as three to as big as 50 members. Everyone in the group participates in gathering food, keeping a look out for predators and taking care of the babies. They are super cute, with bushy, brown-striped fur, a small, pointed face and large eyes surrounded by dark patches. They average about 50 centimetres long, including their tail.
- B.** Meerkats live in the deserts and grasslands of the southern tip of Africa. These extremely social animals live together in burrows, which they dig with their long, sharp claws. Living underground keeps them safe from predators and out of the harsh African heat. These burrows can be 5 metres long and contain multiple entrances, tunnels, and rooms. A group will use up to five separate burrows at a time.
- C.** Meerkats only go outside during the daytime. Each morning as the sun comes up, they emerge and begin looking for food. They use their keen sense of smell to locate their favourite foods, which include beetles, caterpillars, spiders and scorpions. They'll also eat small reptiles, birds, eggs, fruit and plants. Back at the burrow, several babysitters stay behind to watch over newborn pups.
- D.** Squirrel-sized meerkats are mongooses famed for their upright posture. While the rest of the group forages for food, one of the meerkats (or sometimes more), called a sentry, will find a high point, like a termite mound and perch on its back legs. From here it scans the sky and desert for predators such as eagles, hawks and jackals.
- E.** Meerkats dig safe places called bolt holes throughout their foraging area, where they can hide in an emergency. But if caught in the open by a predator, a meerkat will try to look fierce, lying on its back and showing its teeth and claws. If a group is confronted, the meerkats will stand together, arching their backs, raising their hair and hissing.
- F.** Meerkats are not considered endangered. But they live a very difficult life in the African desert, constantly threatened by hungry predators, and burrow-flooding rainstorms. Meerkats are very attentive to their pups. Pups do not go out of the den for several weeks. During this period, at least one helper keeps the pups inside the den and defends them against neighboring meerkats, which would kill them. Once allowed out of the den, pups follow the pack.

If you've been watching the news lately, chances are you'll have heard lots about an illness that's affecting people around the world, called coronavirus.

Coronaviruses are a family of viruses that affect animals. Occasionally, coronaviruses have been known to move from animals to humans. The coronavirus we're talking about today is a new virus, which causes an illness called COVID-19.

It's not completely clear how the outbreak started, but it's thought it's likely to have begun in Wuhan, China, at a local market known to sell wild animal meat.

We still don't know for sure which animal sparked the outbreak but it's thought that the new virus could have originated in bats. Bats weren't sold at the market, but they may have come into contact with the animals that were.

As we haven't encountered this virus before, scientists are still working hard to discover exactly how it spreads. Similar viruses, like colds and flu, spread through water droplets in coughs and sneezes. These droplets can live on surfaces and spread when someone touches them with their hands. People become infected when they then touch their hands to their mouth, nose or eyes.

For the most people, including kids, this coronavirus isn't dangerous. It will make them feel poorly for a short time, before they make a full recovery. For a few people, like the elderly and people who have long-term health conditions such as diabetes, heart disease or asthma, the risk of becoming very ill is more serious. That's why these people are making extra efforts to have less face-to-face contact with others at the moment. There are plenty of small, easy things you can do. (You probably know some of them already, but at this time, we all just need to be extra sensible and cautious as we go about our daily lives and activities.

Wash your hands more regularly, for at least 20 seconds. If you can't wash your hands with soap and water, then use hand-sanitiser. Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, nose and mouth. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

Thankfully; there are lots of people like scientists, government officials and medical professionals working extremely hard to learn how to prevent, control and treat this virus better.

Scientists are working with speed to create a vaccine, which will give people protection from the virus. It's hoped that they'll have a vaccine ready.

In the meantime, there are lots of changes being made to help slow the spread of coronavirus. People who feel unwell, and the people they live with, are being asked to self-isolate. This basically means staying at home for 14 days so that you don't pass the virus on to others. People can't come to visit you during this time, but you can go outside if you have a private garden or balcony.

People in some countries or cities are being asked to practise 'social distancing'. This basically means keeping your distance from others, avoiding social gatherings like meeting with friends, going to sporting events or gigs. This is to help prevent the virus from passing from person to person.
