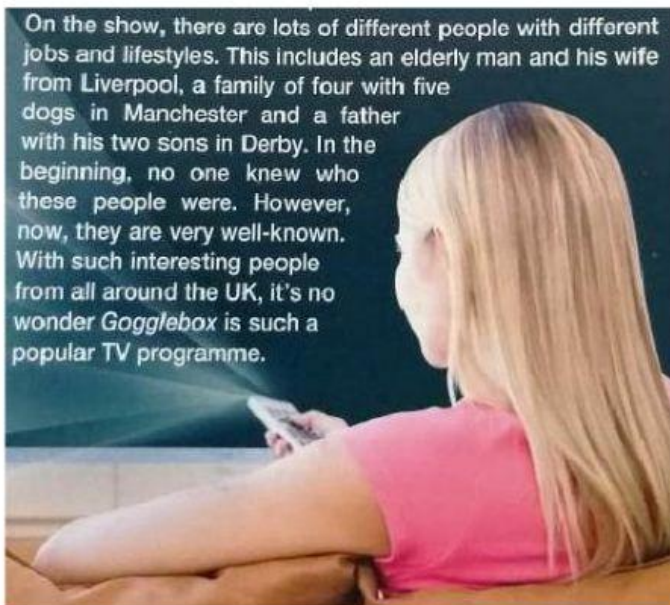
Task 1. Read the text and mark the sentences below as **T (true) or **F** (false)**
