- A.** Nearly every day for the past six months, a group of volunteers has been pushing and pulling a large blue stone through dirt and mud. The stone weighs three tons, and it comes from the Preseli Mountains in southwestern Wales. The group's goal is to move the stone 240 miles across land and water to the Salisbury Plain in England. There, the stone will be reunited with its long-lost cousins at a place called Stonehenge.
- B.** About 5,000 years ago, people began building a mysterious circle of blue stones in Salisbury Plain. The building of Stonehenge probably took hundreds of years to complete. It could have taken even more. Nobody knows for sure. So, this structure could be thousands of years old. Each stone weighs about three tons and archeologists believe that all of the stones were transported from Wales to Salisbury.
- C.** The goal of this year's stone-moving project is to prove that it would have been possible for the people of long ago to move the stones to Salisbury. The goal is attractive to those people who do not believe in the importance and miracle of Stonehenge. The group has used wooden sleds, logs, barges, and pure physical strength to move one stone many miles. The group leader Philip Bowen believes the effort will take a total of almost nine months.
- D.** Stonehenge has attracted and mystified people for centuries. No one sure why it was built, but its design was apparently based on the movement of the sun. Its 80 stones are arranged in a circular design with one stone - the "heel stone" - set apart. Many of the stones stand upright with horizontal stones laid across the top to form arches. If you stand in the centre of the circle on the summer or winter solstice, the longest and shortest days of the year, the sun sets directly over the heel stone.
- E.** For the rest of the year, the sunset moves to different parts of the circle. Scientists have invented many theories to explain Stonehenge. Some people think it was a calendar used to keep track of days and years. Some think it was a monument for sun worship, or perhaps a monument where people went to honour the dead. Others think that aliens who visited Earth thousands of years ago left Stonehenge behind just to let us know they were here.
- F.** For whatever reason it was built, Stonehenge continues to amaze people who see it. Every year on the solstice, thousands of people go to Stonehenge to dance and celebrate. It is an important day for a lot of Stonehenge's admirers. They believe it is a special place. People come to see Stonehenge because it is so impossibly big and so impossibly old; some are searching for a connection with a prehistoric past; some come to witness the workings of a massive astronomical observatory.

Henry VIII

Henry VIII was King of England and Ireland from 21 April 1509 to 28 January 1547, and is perhaps one of the most famous monarchs in English history. Born on 28 June 1491 at Greenwich Palace in London, Henry was the second eldest son to Henry VII and Elizabeth of York. The young prince was never expected to become king, but when his older brother, Arthur, Prince of Wales, died unexpectedly at the age of 15, Henry became heir to the throne. Upon the death of his father, Henry

was coronated on 24 June 1509 — he was just 17 years old. He immediately set about marrying his elder brother's widow Catherine of Aragon.

Henry hired some of Europe's finest craftsmen and gardeners to transform Hampton Court into a sumptuous palace. The young King Henry handsome, clever and fun in contrast to his boring father. He was over six-foot-tall and loved hunting, composing music, and throwing expensive parties!

He loved spending money. The Tudor era was a time of great change, new ideas were emerging about science, art, and culture, and great sailing expeditions uncovered new lands. Henry wanted to show off all his wealth and built many magnificent palaces - like Hampton Court Palace - and castles that would impress his subjects and rivals.

But, in his later years, all that indulgence took its toll on his physical health. The older King Henry was hugely overweight and struggled to walk. He also suffered from a gruesome ulcer on his leg that caused him constant pain - which may have explained his bad temper!

One of the biggest changes that Henry brought about during his reign was the English Reformation. After 24 years of marriage, his first wife, Catherine had failed to give Henry a male heir. Frustrated, he went to the Pope for a divorce, but the Pope wouldn't allow it.

Unhappy, Henry took matters into his own hands. He created his own Church of England and named himself the head. He appointed Thomas Cranmer as Archbishop of Canterbury, and made him grant a divorce - easy! Thus, ended the first of Henry's marriages.

The religious reform caused widespread divide in England, with many people disliking the new church. Followers of the new church were known as protestants, whereas worshippers of the Roman Catholic Church were called Catholics. There was often tension between the two groups — an unrest that would last for many years.

Henry's actions were revolutionary because they changed the identity of English religion. If it weren't for Henry's desperate desire for a male heir, the reformation may never have happened, and English religion could have been very different today.

Henry died in 1547 at the age of 55, riddled with health issues. He was buried in St. George's Chapel in Windsor Castle next to his third wife Henry is often remembered as a fierce King! But he is also seen as a great symbol of the monarchy. He was a controversial King who made many scandalous and significant changes during his rule.

Three of his children went on to rule England after him, and ironically after his desperate pursuit of a male heir, it was his daughter Elizabeth who went on to become one of the greatest monarchs in the English history, Elizabeth I.
