

Open and Closed Syllables

Open Syllables

1. This syllable has only one vowel.
2. The vowel is the last letter in the syllable.
3. The vowel makes it's long sound.

he

EXAMPLES

I, why, me, my, she, he, be, no

vs

Closed Syllables

1. This syllable has 1 vowel.
2. The vowel is followed by one or more consonants

pet

EXAMPLES

hotdog, catnip, crash, still, bed, blend, milk
