

Because and so

Look at these sentences. Notice the difference between **because** and **so**.

- 1 a We were very tired **because** we didn't sleep on the plane.
 b We didn't sleep on the plane **so** we were very tired.
- 2 a Jo can speak Spanish **so** she ordered the food.
 b Jo ordered the food **because** she can speak Spanish.

Tip • We usually put **because** and **so** in the middle of the sentence.

1 I didn't go swimming. I can't swim. so-because

2 I was very tired. I went to bed early. so-because

3 He went by train. He hates flying. so-because

4 There weren't any taxis. We rented a car. so-because

5 I closed the window. It was cold. so-because

6 It was cold. I shut the window. so-because

7 The water wasn't clean. We didn't swim. so-because

Look at these sentence. Notice how we use **when**.

first second

When we arrived at our hotel, we slept for nine hours.

- We can put **when** at the beginning or in the middle of the sentence.

We slept for nine hours **when** we got to our hotel.

- We usually use a comma (,) if **when** is at the beginning of the sentence.
