


Educate Yourself: Examining Consequences

A consequence is something that happens as a result of a particular action or set of conditions.

There are good and bad consequences. A bad or negative consequence decreases the chance that a behaviour will occur in the future. Negative consequences are considered to be unpleasant. A negative consequence can result in the loss of a privilege, verbal punishment, corporal punishment or confinement. A good or positive consequence increases the chance that a behaviour will occur in the future. Positive consequences are considered pleasant: Praises, awards or treats. Consequences teach children to think before they act.

Children must learn that their actions lead to results that can be positive or negative. Children must learn that life is full of choices. Choices made can greatly influence any outcome. **S.O.D.A.** **S**-Stop and state the problem. **O**- consider the options or choices and the consequences of these choices. **D**- decide and choose the best solution. **A**-act on your decision.

Example: Child studied for test, the consequence would be a positive one with the child receiving a passing mark.

Example: Underage sexual intercourse without protection, the consequence would be a negative one with a child catching a sexually transmitted disease, a teenager with a child, extra bills to take care of a baby.

 - (b) Tom will be made a prefect by the teacher.
 - (c) Tom will be sent to the Principal's Office to be disciplined.
 - (d) Tom will be praised by the teacher for his actions.

4. Sam's mother who is a smoker but is trying to quit leaves a half-smoked cigarette in the ash tray. She goes in the kitchen to cook breakfast. Sam's friends have been experimenting with smoking and have been teasing him for being too scared to try to smoke at least once. Sam sneaks the cigarette and puts it to his lips and immediately begins coughing, wheezing, and feeling sick as he inhales the smoke.

What do you predict will happen to Sam?

Do you think that Sam has made a good choice in his actions? Why or why not?
