

Possessive Nouns Practice

Tip

A **possessive noun** shows ownership.

girl's test - test belongs to the girl

Singular nouns form their possessives by adding "'s."
the girl's test

Plural nouns that end in "s" add only an apostrophe.
all the girls' tests

Plural nouns that do not end in "s" add "'s."
the children's tests
