Climate activist Greta Thunberg, 16, (address) the U.N.'s Climate Action Summit in New York City on Monday, September 23 2019. Here's the full transcript of Thunberg's speech, beginning with her response to a question about
the message she has for world leaders.
My message is that we (watch) you.
This is all wrong. I shouldn't be up here. I should be back in school on the other
side of the ocean. Yet you all (come) to us young people for hope. How
dare you!
You (steal) my dreams and my childhood with your empty words. And
yet I'm one of the lucky ones. People (suffer). People (die).
Entire ecosystems (collapse). We are in the beginning of a mass
extinction, and all you can talk about is money and fairy tales of eternal economic
growth. How dare you!
For more than 30 years, the science (be) crystal clear. How dare you
continue to look away and come here saying that you(do) enough, when
the politics and solutions needed are still nowhere in sight.
You say you (hear) us and that you (understand) the urgency.
But no matter how sad and angry I am, I do not want to believe that. Because if
you really (understand) the situation and still (keep) on
failing to act, then you (be) evil. And that I refuse to believe.
The popular idea of cutting our emissions in half in 10 years only gives us a 50%
The popular race of carting our chinosono in han in 10 jears only gives as a 30%

chance of staying below 1.5 degrees [Celsius], and the risk of setting off

irreversible chain reactions beyond human control.

Fifty percent may be acceptable to you. But those numbers do not include
tipping points, most feedback loops, additional warming hidden by toxic air
pollution or the aspects of equity and climate justice. They also (rely)
on my generation sucking hundreds of billions of tons of your CO2 out of the air
with technologies that barely exist.

So a 50% risk is simply not acceptable to us — we who have to live with the consequences.

To have a 67% chance of staying below a 1.5 degrees global temperature rise – the best odds given by the [Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change] – the world had 420 gigatons of CO2 left to emit back on Jan. 1st, 2018. Today that figure is already down to less than 350 gigatons.

How dare you pretend that this can be solved with just 'business as usual' and some technical solutions? With today's emissions levels, that remaining CO2 budget will be entirely gone within less than 8 1/2 years.

There(be) not be any solutions or plans presented in line with these
figures here today, because these numbers are too uncomfortable. And you are
still not mature enough to tell it like it is.

You (fail) us. But the young people (start) to understand your
betrayal. The eyes of all future generations (be) upon you. And if you
(choose) to fail us, I say: We(never forgive) you.

We (not let) you get away with this.	Right here, right now is where we
(draw) the line. The world	(wake) up. And change
(come), whether you like it or not.
