

PIECES OF A PARAGRAPH

Topic Sentence:

1. tells the reader the main idea of your paragraph
(should be general with no details)

Supporting Sentences:

1. supporting details
2. specific to support main idea
3. written and organized in a clear and logical order

Concluding Sentence:

1. wraps up your paragraph and ties everything together, but does not introduce any new information
(sometimes a restatement of your main idea)


