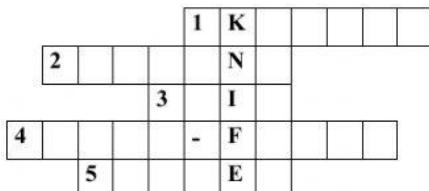

Since our friends mean so much to us, it is not surprising that the happiest marriages are also friendships. 'Once the romantic stage of a relationship has passed, it is friendship that holds people together', says Rowe. If the couple do not make the transition, they will either split up or stay together and seek friendship with others.

Who needs friends? According to most psychologists we all do, particularly nowadays when so many other aspects of modern life are changing. It seems that having friends keeps us both healthy and happy. People often say that there have been times when a close friend has not only saved their sanity but their lives. Having friends protects us against illness and depression.

C

But is friendship equally important to women and men? According to author Rhonda Pritchard, women usually have more close friends than men. 'You tell a friend things that you would never tell a partner', says one woman she interviewed. 'Friends just accept you as you are'. For men, friendship is usually based on doing things together rather than the intimate conversations that are typical of women friends.

Psychologist Dorothy Rowe says that many of us now turn to friends, instead of our families, for advice, comfort and security.
