

OTHER / ANOTHER

a) Study these examples:

	SINGULAR	PLURAL
DEFINITE	Bring me the other chair , please. Bring me the other one , please. Bring me the other , please. (= there is only one more chair.)	Bring me the other chairs , please. Bring me the others , please. (= I need the rest of the chairs.)
INDEFINITE	Bring me another chair , please. Bring me another , please. (= one more chair, any chair.)	Bring me another three chairs , please. (= I need three more chairs.)
	Bring me some other chair , please. (= I need a different chair.)	Bring me some other chairs , please. (= I need different chairs.) Other chairs are cheaper. Others are cheaper. (= different chairs.)

Points to remember:

- **THE OTHER** can be an adjective, so it can be singular or plural:

I saw her **the other day**.
I prefer **the other books**.

As a pronoun, it is singular:

Close one eye, and look at this with **the other**.

- **OTHERS / THE OTHERS** are pronouns, that is why they can be plural:

I like some of **his films**, but I don't like **others**.
I like **his early films**, but I don't like **the others**.

- **ANOTHER** is usually singular, but with a number after it, it becomes plural:

Bring me **another beer**, please.
Bring me **another two beers**, please.

- However, **OTHER** is always a plural adjective (it is a typical mistake to use it as singular):

Other children don't play videogames all day, Johnny!
